#### **DEAR FRIENDS**

I came across these beautiful words recently, from a poem called "Leisure" by W. H. Davies:

"What is this life if, full of care,
We have no time to stand and stare.
No time to stand beneath the boughs
And stare as long as sheep or cows.
No time to see, when woods we pass,
Where squirrels hide their nuts in grass.
No time to see, in broad daylight,
Streams full of stars, like skies at night.
No time to turn at Beauty's glance,
And watch her feet, how they can dance.
No time to wait till her mouth can
Enrich that smile her eyes began.
A poor life this if, full of care,
We have no time to stand and stare".

These words, written over a hundred years ago, seem to be good for an August magazine. Whether the school holidays affect your life, whether you are travelling this summer, or even if you are simply continuing your usual pattern at home, the month of August can offer a different pace and pattern.

Followers of Jesus are encouraged to stop and stare. Jesus said "And why do you worry and labour? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labour or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendour was dressed like one of these". Take time, stop and stare.

Our lives can be busy and frantic, always on the go but God didn't create us to withstand that constant volume of intensity. God offered us Sabbath - time, not exclusively a Sunday - when we can contemplate, rest and pray deeply about things. To remember that Jesus often went off to 'a certain place' to pray, to reflect and to make space for God and to stop and stare. If Jesus needed to do that then we must follow his example.

So this August, I encourage us all to find some space, take time, grasp the opportunity to just stop and stare and see and listen for what God can offer you, as well as noticing the beauty around us.

**Online Safety** — In July, Bishop Rachel took a group of local young people with her to the House of Lords. Students from the Cotswolds School and All Saints Academy in Cheltenham joined her in addressing MPs, peers and leaders of charities, to speak about social media and the impact that it has had on them. They were speaking together on the day before the Online Safety Bill returned to the House for debate. What an amazing summer we have had! It has been so busy and full of so many adventures I will try to highlight just a few.

**Exam results** - Another absolutely amazing set of exam results for our pupils. In Key Stage 2 SATS our children performed brilliantly in every subject, we were way above the national figures and we were so proud that each child absolutely gave it their all. In Key Stage 1 SATs again our pupils absolutely shone and were above the national figures — such a huge ask when you are only 6 or 7. In the Phonics screening test 75% of our pupils passed which is a great achievement. We are very proud of each and every one of our pupils who gave their very best to these exams.







**School Trips** - This term we have been to Bristol Aquarium, RIAT (the air display at Fairford), had an environmental workshop and even created a fish that was filled with recycled materials and it looks amazing. School trips are a fantastic way of enriching our children's learning and enthusiasm for new knowledge — even when it was so wet the day we went to RIAT!

**School play** - As always we ended the summer term with a fabulous production – this year we performed Goldilocks. It was an action-packed musical with every child in Key Stage 2 involved. We listened, we clapped and we laughed so much - many parents called it a triumph.

Our building project - We are now in the final stages of the project – we hope to be in by the second week of September. The underfloor heating is in and the screed for the floor laid. The cladding is almost complete and it looks absolutely stunning. We will be demolishing the old building at the start of the holidays so for the first two weeks of the new term our Class 1 will be in the Village Hall along with Class 2.

We would like to say a huge thank you to the Village Hall committee for being so incredibly helpful and generous in allowing us to use the Pavilion room as a classroom since Christmas and now we are taking over the main hall. We could not have done the project without their help and support but we are so looking forward to having our own classrooms very soon.
