We got the keys on the Friday afternoon, we moved 2 classrooms out of the village hall on the Saturday morning. We prepared classrooms on the Monday and children started on the Tuesday morning. We are so glad to be in our amazing building earlier than expected and just under budget – it is an absolute miracle!



We are so grateful to all of the wonderful, generous people who have contributed to our project and made this miracle possible. You will be a blessing to many generations of children to come – thank you.

Chickens at TG School Earlier in the summer term we hatched eggs and we were so excited to have so many lovely chicks in our classroom. They have now grown a great deal, the cockerels have been donated to other homes but we still have 3 hens. They have a lovely smart new enclosure and provide us with fresh eggs daily. Some of our older pupils are helping to take care of them by feeding, checking water levels, clearing the enclosure and collecting eggs. We believe this is an important lesson in taking care of animals and keeping them healthy.
