## ***NEWS FROM THE WIDER CHURCH ...***

I was delighted recently to be a part of a decision in the Diocese of Gloucester to assert the importance of our care of the environment. In a large gathering, we agreed a motion that:

- recognises we are facing a climate and ecological emergency which is a crisis for the whole of God's creation and;
- calls on all parts of the Diocese of Gloucester to work towards an 80 per cent reduction in emissions of CO2 and other greenhouse gases no later than 2030 based on 2006 data (replacing the current target of an 80% reduction by 2050), and to take other measures in order to be carbon neutral, also by 2030.

This commitment includes bringing forward previous goals of reducing emissions by 20 years!

These are not easy goals to achieve – especially when you consider that all of our buildings are very old and are listed buildings protected by quite strict planning conditions. But I do feel these are hugely important goals to be working towards. The Bible teaches us that it is a part of our Christian living to be stewards of God's creation, looking after it, and caring for the most vulnerable people within it.

Our Churchwarden team, here in this Benefice, have also echoed this commitment, by agreeing to having our own Environmental Policies which help us to ask the right questions and to make good decisions for God's creation. These will be discussed at each of our Annual Parochial Church Meetings. We want to live as individuals and church communities doing our best for our wider world.

## **LENT**

This Lent, our focus in our Churches is going to be reflecting on what more we can each do to make a difference for the environment. We will be challenging one another to recycle more, to reduce our carbon usage, to limit our waste and to help those who are most vulnerable to climate change. Perhaps you might like to join us?

### **Lent Lunches**

Through the period of Lent, we are hosting community lunches at Upper Slaughter Village Hall each Thursday at 12.30pm (starting on 27<sup>th</sup> February and running through 5<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup>, 26<sup>th</sup> March and 2<sup>nd</sup> April). All are welcome for soup, bread and fruit.

No charge, but donations are welcome – any donations beyond costs will be donated to the North Cotswold Foodbank.

### **Lent Evenings**

On Wednesdays 11<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> March, at 7pm, we will be holding Lent Talks at Naunton Village Hall. Each talk will be focussed around the Environment and how we interact with it. All welcome – to each week, or whichever you can make.

### **Recycling during Lent**

As a part of our Lenten observance this year, we are joining with the Terracycle Scheme. This enables some of the plastics to be recycled that currently aren't collected from our homes. You can bring along to the Lent talks and Lent lunches any:

- crisp and snack packets, including Pringles tubes
- toothpaste tubes, toothbrushes and associated packaging

These will then be passed on to be recycled.

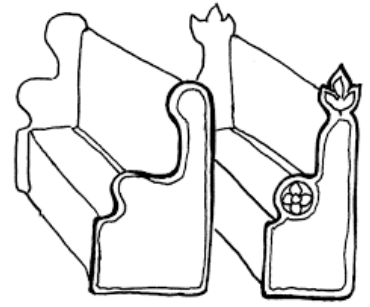

As some will already know, St. Andrew's, Naunton has organised a monthly cinema since October 2012, built on the CDC's 'Rural Cinema' scheme. The nearest commercial cinema is Cheltenham, a 1-hour round trip, so our village cinema provides a wonderful opportunity for villagers to see films that many of them simply wouldn't otherwise see, in practice. We always have an interval and we also run a licensed bar (and sell ice-creams!),



so it is a very good social occasion as well. From around 200 residents, and with loyal support from some cinema-goers from surrounding villages, we have an average audience of around 40. As you can see from the photo, this sometimes includes a (very quiet) dog! The biggest audience to date (that was for 'The Lady in the Van'!) has been 97! The films have ranged from the rather serious such as '12 years a slave' and 'I, Daniel Blake' to the frothy such as 'Crazy Rich Asians' and 'Paddington', with an eclectic mix between.

The cinema is held inside the church itself. As far as we know, that's unique in the area - most rural cinemas are held in village halls. This provides the bonus of using the wonderful mediaeval building for an additional social activity - some of our audience have crossed the church threshold for the first time. It also raises some money for the church; being part of the CDC's scheme avoids our having to pay for equipment and also reduces the film royalty costs, as both of these are shared with other villages around Gloucestershire. The amount raised is modest, because the idea is fun in the church, rather than fund-raising, but every little helps.
