## **WIDER CHURCH NEWS**

### **Katrina’s Sabbatical**

Katrina will be taking some sabbatical leave from work this year, meaning that she will be off from 1st August for three months. The concept of a Sabbatical comes from the Old Testament, and the agricultural practice of giving the land a rest period every seven years. The Church of England encourages its leaders to take some time on sabbatical and talks of it being a time for spiritual and theological renewal and to focus on personal well-being.

This will be Katrina’s first Sabbatical (since being Ordained in 2000) and she is looking forward to family time, travelling, reading and exploring music. She is hoping to practice the piano too, something she hasn’t done for years!

During these three months, our church life will continue, ably led by our Churchwardens’ team, and Rev’d’s Catherine and Sue.

## **Good News for Sue Pestell!**

We are delighted to announce that Sue has recently been 'signed off' by the Bishop, which means that she has completed the training requirements within her Curacy, with flying colours. Her three years with us have been focussed on training and building experience and she has fulfilled this stage now. So, the question is what next?

We are equally excited to share that she will be staying with us! Sue wants to continue her ministry with holding together her passions for being rooted in a parish, alongside supporting prisoners and prison staff. So, she will become a Prison Chaplain (one day a week) and an Associate Priest here with us in this Benefice (two days a week).

Sue will be licensed into this new role by the Bishop, and we are holding a celebration service to mark it on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> July at 7pm at St. Andrew's Naunton – do come along for a service and refreshments afterwards!

The bird population has grown and garden watering has been necessary. Our remoteness has brought many walkers and cyclists escaping covid for two years now. St Faith's has reverted to its regular monthly services on second Sundays.

## **NEW 'SHEDDERS' WELCOME! BOURTON'S MEN IN SHEDS GROUP INVITES NEW MEMBERS TO JOIN**



Bourton's Men in Sheds group, which is run by charity Cotswold Friends, is inviting new members to come along and give 'shedding' a try at their workshop at the Royal British Legion site in the town. The group gives people the opportunity to make things for the local community or for themselves, and to socialise over a cuppa. It meets three times a week, on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, between 9.30am and 12.30pm. Cotswold Friends' four Men in Sheds groups across the north Cotswolds have been set up to help tackle loneliness and isolation and get people involved in community projects. In addition to the Bourton group, there are also Men in Sheds groups in Moreton, Northleach, and a new group in Campden which has been launched in partnership with Campden Home Nursing. Do get in touch if you would like to join. All are welcome – not just men. Our volunteers are here to support you and you don't need to have any DIY experience. We make bird houses, bird tables, hedgehog houses, wooden letters, a whole range of things. Some people will come to the shed to use their skills, others to share their skills and train some of the other members, and others come to learn some skills or just to talk. Bird boxes made by the Bourton shedders, and by members of Cotswold Friends' three other shed sites, are currently available for a small donation to the charity to cover the costs of making them.
