

Our wonderful rector, Katrina, has now left to take up her new role as Archdeacon of Cheltenham. Her final service at Temple Guiting was a truly joyful occasion for our Benefice, the church was packed, full of children, laughter, and warmth. It was a fitting send-off for Katrina, Nick, Ruth, and Freddie, and we wish them every happiness in their new chapter.

With Katrina's departure, we have now entered the period of vacancy. It's a little daunting, of course, but thanks to her careful preparation and the support of so many, we are confident in keeping everything running smoothly. In particular, we are immensely grateful to Sue Pestell, who has taken on a great deal to ensure day-to-day church life continues seamlessly. Thank you, Sue for all your hard work and dedication, we really appreciate it.

As part of this year's church administration, we are renewing the Church Electoral Roll, as required every six years. Forms are being sent to everyone, and the new roll will be prepared and presented at our Annual General Meeting on 8th May in the Village Hall.

Amidst these changes, we also have exciting news from St Peter's Church. The organ has been officially certified under the Historic Organ Listing Scheme, recognising its historical significance. Built in 1855 by Joseph Walker, a highly regarded London organ builder, it is a rare survivor of Victorian craftsmanship. These small village church organs were designed to accompany hymn singing and simple voluntaries, and many have since been altered or lost. Ours remains largely unaltered, retaining its single manual keyboard, mechanical action, and original pipework, which gives

it a distinctive character and charm. However, after nearly 170 years, it is in need of careful restoration to ensure it continues to serve the church and community for generations to come. Securing this historic listing is an important first step, allowing us to begin working towards the considerable funds needed for its restoration. We are hopeful that some grant funding will now be available, but we will also need to fundraise to help cover the rest and preserve this special part of our church's heritage.

The bells of St Peter's have been getting some extra attention too! It's been wonderful to hear them ringing out again after their restoration. Recently, a visiting group from St John's, Redhill (Surrey) filled the village with their beautiful ringing, and another group of bell ringers from the West Country will be joining us on Thursday 27th March, a great opportunity to hear our bells in full peel once more.

As we move into spring, our warm space at Lords of the Manor continues to be a welcoming place to gather. Every second Tuesday from 11 am to 12 noon, we're able to enjoy a hot drink, biscuits, and good company. With the days getting longer, it's been a lovely opportunity to take a break, catch up with friends, and enjoy the changing season together.

Finally, we want to send our love and best wishes to Wayne Gough, who hasn't been well. A true stalwart of the church and village, we've missed seeing him around—whether it's opening up the church or tending his allotment. We hope he's up and about again soon and send our warmest thoughts to his wife, Anthea, who has now stepped down from her role as Church Warden but will continue to offer support at weddings in Upper and Lower Slaughter. We are truly grateful for everything she has done over the years. Liz Gibson has also been a great support to the church for many years, first as Church Warden and, since stepping back, continuing to carry out many duties behind the scenes. Her ongoing dedication is greatly appreciated, and we are thankful for all she does.

With Lent reminding us of patience, perseverance, and the strength of community, we look ahead with gratitude and hope.


